Those who truly understand what life is like *inside* the Kingdom of God, will live it *out* the same way.




God's Kingdom is described as Kingdom of Justice, because God is Just (Psalm 9:7-9).

# Justice Righteousness



### mišpāţ Upņi Upņi

Hebrew word for "Justice"

Better described than defined

Given what you are due

Relates to judgment, law, a decision
that is fair, equitable, deserving



## Sādaq 57T¥

Hebrew word for "Righteousness"

To make right (morally), justice being enacted (in action)

Relational /social (not private);

expressed in daily life;

in family and society



## TSADDIQIM (THE RIGHTEOUS)

"The righteous in the book of Proverbs are by definition those who are <u>willing to disadvantage</u> themselves for the <u>community</u>, while the wicked are those who put their own economic, social, and personal needs ahead of the needs of the community." (Timothy Keller)

## Justice & Righteousness



Justice (mishpat) is the idea of giving people what they are due/deserve - whether punishment, protection, or care.

The Righteous (sadiqim) are the ones who practice this in society - they act fairly, generously, with equity.

## 'Quartet of the Vulnerable'



Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'

## Matthew 25:31-46 (ESV)



We are the last, the least, the lost.

We are the spiritually poor and impoverished; hungry and thirsting for something more - something better.

We have all committed injustice and deserve the wages of sin - death.

God executed His justice on what we deserved, but He took on our injustice; He bore the price of our injustice. There was divine retribution but also divine restoration.
